30th Anniversary AIDS Walk Colorado—August 19th!

You are encouraged to participate in the 30th Anniversary AIDS Walk Colorado in Denver's beautiful downtown Cheeseman Park on Saturday, August 19th.



Over 8,000 people from all over Colorado will come together as a community at Cheesman Park to raise money for vital services for HIV/AIDS clients of Colorado Health Network (Colorado AIDS Project and Howard Dental Center) and other AIDS service organizations throughout Colorado.

The event serves as a day to remember those we have lost to the disease, with panels of the AIDS Memorial Quilt and a 5K Awareness walk through Denver's Capitol Hill neighborhood. Following the walk, the Celebration of Life Festival honors those living with the disease and the progress we've made toward ending this disease. The festival includes numerous vendors, live entertainment, food, beverages, and the 9th annual AIDS Walk Colorado Volleyball Tournament, held in cooperation with the Colorado Gay Volleyball Association.

The annual local AIDS Walk in the Garden of the Gods, "A Walk In the Garden", which raises money for the Southern Colorado AIDS Project (SCAP) will not be held this year. Past participants are encouraged to support the Denver walk. S-CAP supports those living with HIV/AIDS in southeastern Colorado.

Protests Erupt Nationwide Following Trump's Transgender Military Ban Announcement

National and Colorado Springs PFLAG have seen a coming-out surge in the transgender community in recent years. This has rapidly raised the visibility, acceptance and support of transgender persons across the country. The president's announcement on July 26th was met with street protests, statements of support for trans people from a wide range of national leaders, and intense media coverage. ABC News stated that there are currently 2400 active military and 1500 reserve military transgender individuals. Listen at: http://abcn.ws/2w2tnGn

New York Times: "President Trump announced on July 26 that the United States will no longer "accept or allow" transgender people in the United States military, saying American forces 'must be focused on decisive and overwhelming victory' and therefore could not afford to accommodate them.

Mr. Trump made the surprise declaration in a series of posts on Twitter, saying he had come to the decision after talking to generals and military experts, whom he did not name."

And what follows may be the reason, as described by Politico:

Trans Youth Education and Support (TYES)

Politico: "After a week sparring with his attorney general and steaming over the Russia investigation consuming his agenda, President Donald Trump was closing in on an important win. House Republicans were planning to pass a spending bill stacked with his campaign promises, including money to build his border wall with Mexico.

"But an internal House Republican fight over transgender troops was threatening to blow up the bill. And House GOP insiders feared they might not have the votes to pass the legislation because defense hawks wanted a ban on Pentagon-funded sex reassignment operations — something GOP leaders wouldn't give them.

"They turned to Trump, who didn't hesitate. In the flash of a tweet, he announced that transgender troops would be banned altogether. Trump's sudden decision was, in part, a last-ditch attempt to save a House proposal full of his campaign promises that was on the verge of defeat, numerous congressional and White House sources said."

One Colorado: Spokesman Daniel Ramos stated: "This is yet another example of the Trump Administration attacking the most vulnerable among us instead of bringing Americans together to fix the problems that face all of us. Transgender people — like all Americans — should be judged for their qualifications, nothing more, nothing less. As we learned in repealing Don't Ask, Don't Tell, allowing service members to serve with integrity strengthens our armed forces.

"Our veterans and military deserve better and we will fight against this vicious attack on dignity and equality. Transgender people are our friends, neighbors, and coworkers. They are veterans who have served with honor, and active duty service members who have sacrificed to protect our freedoms. When it comes to being able to serve their country, earn a living, having a place to live, or being served by a business, transgender people should be treated like anyone else and not be discriminated against."





One year ago today, I dealt with the trauma of the Pulse massacre alone, in a foreign country, feeling for the first time how much people hated me, and reeling because this was not the first tragedy and it won't be the last.

Since then, my definition of pride has changed to encompass the cruel irony that 49 of us were slaughtered during Pride Month.

So here is what pride means to me now:

I'm so proud of us for turning grief into community, strength, and love, over and over again; I hate that we have to.

I'm so proud of us for finding each other across time and space, over and over again; I hate that we have to.

I'm so proud of us for waking up every morning and making it through another day of slurs and weird looks and jokes at our expense; I hate that we have to endure that.

We do this shit over and over and over again. Every single day is the anniversary of something horrific and another day that we refuse to give up.

We exist in a world that says we should not, we love ourselves in a world that teaches us self-hate from the moment we are born, and that is the fiercest, bravest thing I can imagine.

This Pride Month, I could not be more proud.
