This Mom Really Gets It

A friend mentioned that her niece, Kimi Jones of Seattle, is raising her own M-F child, 17, and now also her brother's F-M child, 14, after his family situation cratered. Here's what Kimi told her aunt:

"My boyfriend asked the other day, 'how many more kids should I expect you to take on?' and I laughed and replied, 'depends on how many more need my help.' "

"We all give what we can, and really, if you have ever been faced with [either] being a trans ally or having a child commit suicide, it's not a hard choice."

"I only hope I can ingrain in all of my children, rainbow or not, that they are amazing human beings, worthy of love and acceptance. Give them a sanctuary to retreat to when they unapologetically interact with a world that will be cruel to them."

Jennicca Mabe, founder of Path2Empathy, spoke at our September PFLAG meeting about the program she has created to undercut bullying and stereotyping in elementary, middle and high schools by teaching students how to experience empathy. The program has been used for several years in schools in the Pikes Peak region. Early research shows that it works. In November, PFLAG received the following message from Jennicca:

It breaks down cultural, racial, and economic barriers while helping shed at risk behaviors in order to see the world through the eyes of another. But could we prove its effectiveness with numbers?
