

Appreciating Associate Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy

At the July PFLAG meeting, PFLAG Board Member Bill Oliver will discuss the influence of Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy and will present "Overruled! The Case That Brought Down Sodomy Laws" a short film made by Lamba Legal about a landmark case for LGBT rights, *Lawrence v. Texas* (2003).

Nominated by President Ronald Reagan, Justice Kennedy took office in February 1988. Kennedy became the most senior Associate Justice on the court following the death of Antonin Scalia in February 2016. Since the retirement of Sandra Day O'Connor in 2006, he has been the "swing vote" (5-4) in many decisions.

He has written <u>four</u> major opinions in support of gay rights, and his was the swing vote in two of the cases.

Pope Francis Says Church Should Apologize for Discriminating Against Gays, Ask for Forgiveness

Aboard the Papal Plane (Reuters) — June 25, 2016

Pope Francis said on Sunday that Christians and the Roman Catholic Church should seek forgiveness from homosexuals for the way they had treated them.

Speaking to reporters aboard the plane taking him back to Rome from Armenia, he also said the Church should ask forgiveness for the way it has treated women, for turning a blind eye to child labor and for "blessing so many weapons" in the past.

In the hour-long freewheeling conversation that has become a trademark of his international travels, Francis was asked if he agreed with recent comments by a German Roman Catholic cardinal that the Church should apologize to gays.

Francis looked sad when the reporter asked if an apology was made more urgent by the killing of 49 people at a gay club in Orlando, Florida this month.

He recalled Church teachings that homosexuals "should not be discriminated against. They should be respected, accompanied pastorally." He added: "I think that the Church not only should apologize ... to a gay per-

son whom it offended but it must also apologize to the poor as well, to the women who have been exploited, to children who have been exploited by (being forced to) work. It must apologize for having blessed so many weapons."

The Church teaches that homosexual tendencies are not sinful but homosexual acts are, and that homosexuals should try to be chaste.

Francis repeated a slightly modified version of the now-famous "Who am I to judge?" comment he made about gays on the first foreign trip after his election in 2013.

He said: "The question is: if a person who has that condition, who has good will, and who looks for God, who are we to judge?"

Vatican spokesman Father Federico Lombardi said that the pope, by saying "has that condition", did not imply a medical condition but "a person in that situation". In Italian, the word "condition" can also mean "situation".

"We Christians have to apologize for so many things, not just for this (treatment of gays), but we must ask for forgiveness, not just apologize! Forgiveness! Lord, it is a word we forget so often!" he said.

Francis has been hailed by many in the gay community for being the most merciful pope toward them in recent history and conservative Catholics have criticized him for making comments they say are ambiguous with regard to sexual morality.

He told reporters on the plane "there are traditions in some countries, some cultures, that have a different mentality about this question (homosexuals)" and there are "some (gay) demonstrations that are too offensive for some".

But he suggested that those were not grounds for discrimination or marginalization of gays.

Same-Sex Marriages Triple After Victories

Three years after the U.S. Supreme Court forced the federal government to recognize same-sex marriages, and one year after the justices told holdout states to do the same, droves of LGBT Americans have been taking advantage of their new rights.


A Prudential Financial Inc. survey of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Americans has found that far fewer are single — and far more are married — than four years ago. While the drumbeat of coast-to-coast legalization was undoubtedly a driving force, the speed of this nationwide sprint to the altar has been remarkable, the study showed. Overall, 30 percent of LGBT respondents said they were married, up from just 8 percent in 2012.

The LGBT population is notoriously difficult to survey. It's hard for pollsters to find a group that is just a fraction of the overall population and that has historically had reason to be discreet. Prudential surveyed 35,000 Americans online to find 1,376 people ages 25-70 who identified as LGBT.

You and Your Gender Identity: A Guide to Discovery

Local therapist and PFLAG friend Dara Hoffman-Fox, LPC, has just published her first book, *You and Your Gender Identity: A Guide to Discovery.* The book was created for those who are overwhelmed by their feelings of confusion and uncertainty surrounding their gender identity. Hoffman-Fox helps readers gain more clarity about their gender by leading them along a self-paced, three-stage approach to gender exploration.

"Gender identity confusion can complicate a person's entire understanding of who they are," explains Hoffman-Fox. "This can create stress, uncertainty of one's place in the world, interpersonal



difficulty, not having a solid 'sense of self,' and many other issues. This is why it is important and needs to be explored."

"The question I am asked more than any other is, 'Can you please help me figure out my gender identity?" Hoffman-Fox says. "This book is my way of doing something to help those who are in need of guidance, answers, and relief around questions they are having about this essential component of who they are."

A Licensed Professional Counselor and gender therapist in private practice, she is a thought leader on transgender issues who frequently serves as a resource for the media.
